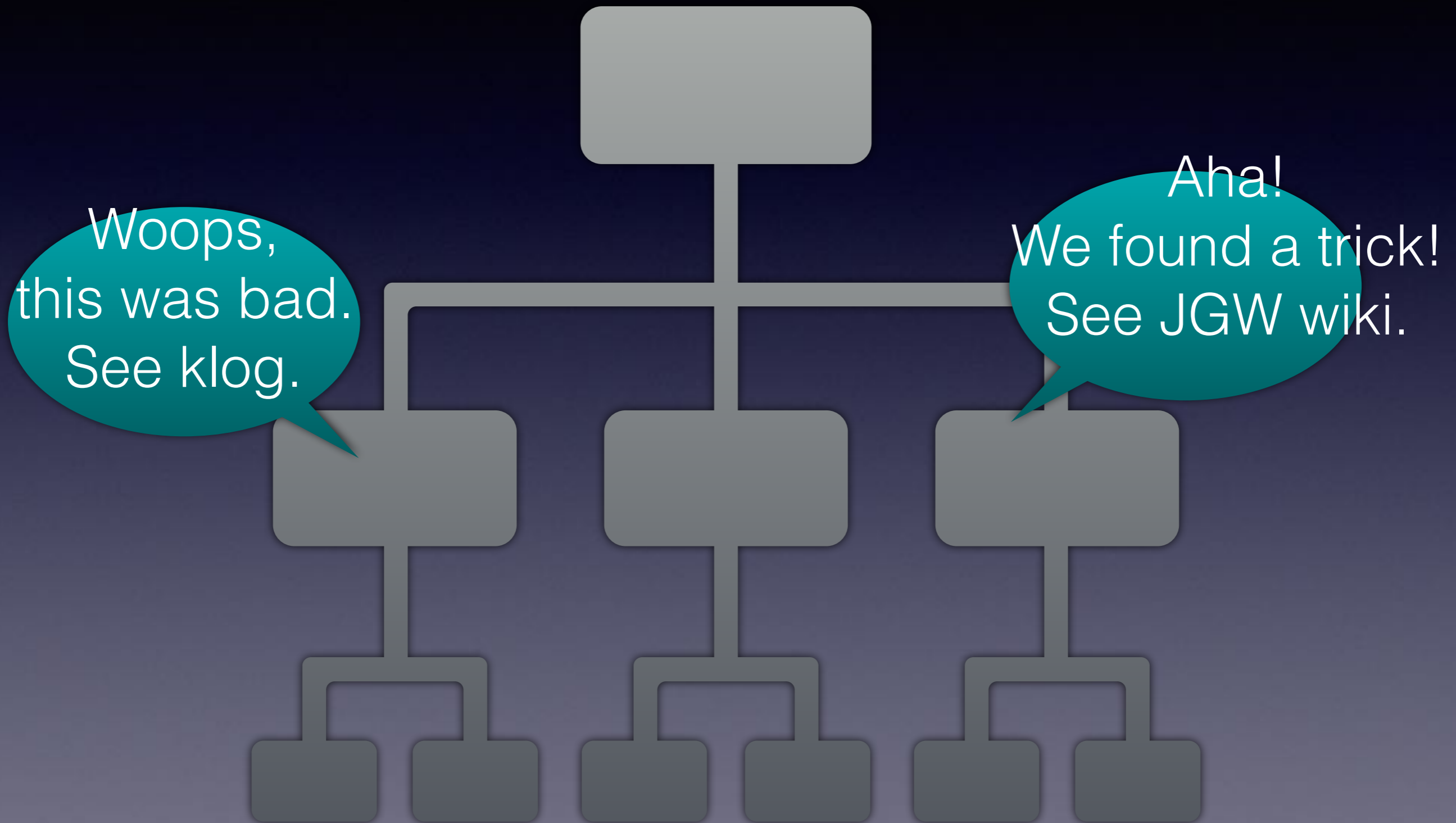

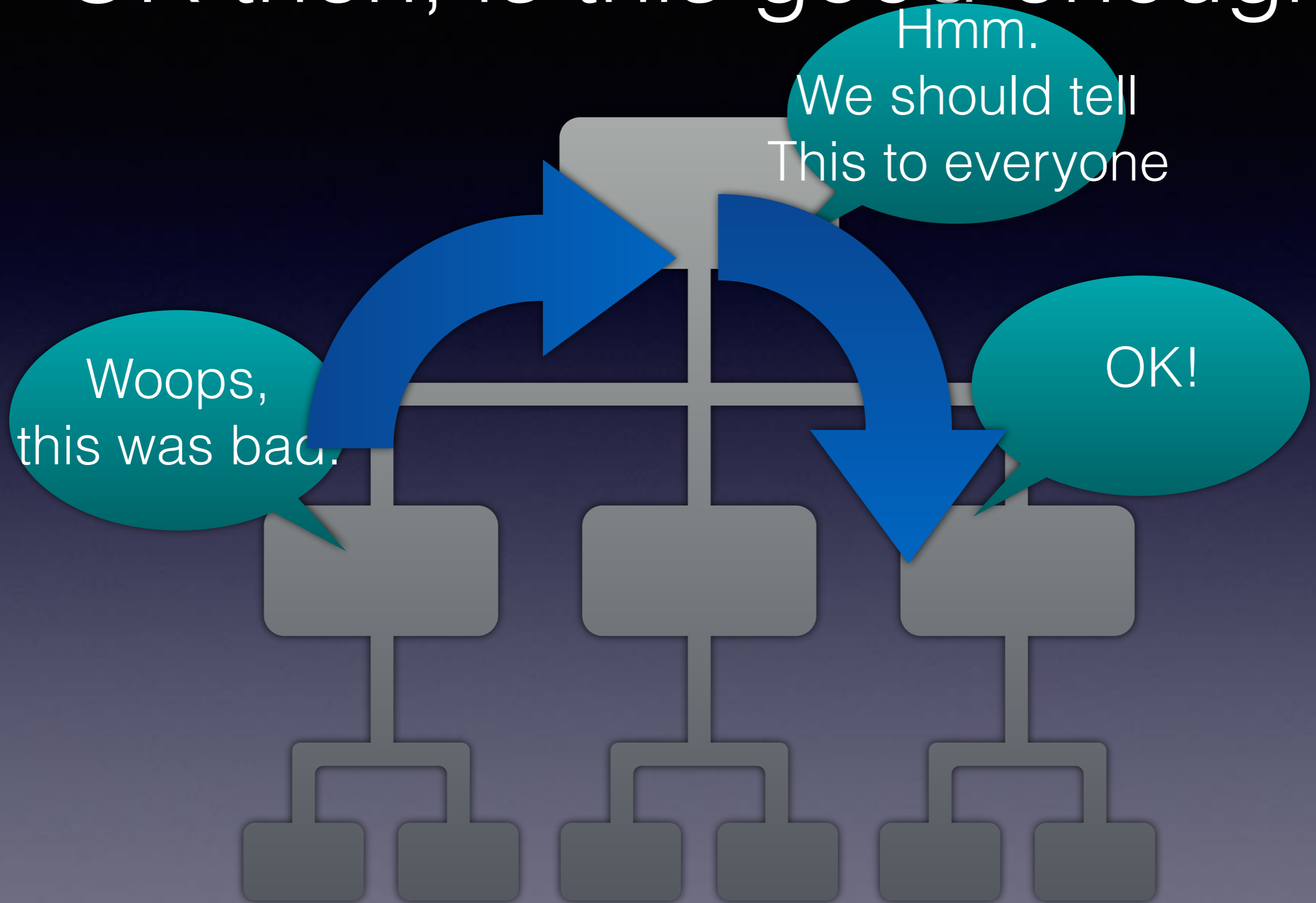
# Several Months Later...

We didn't know such tricks, failure modes, etc!



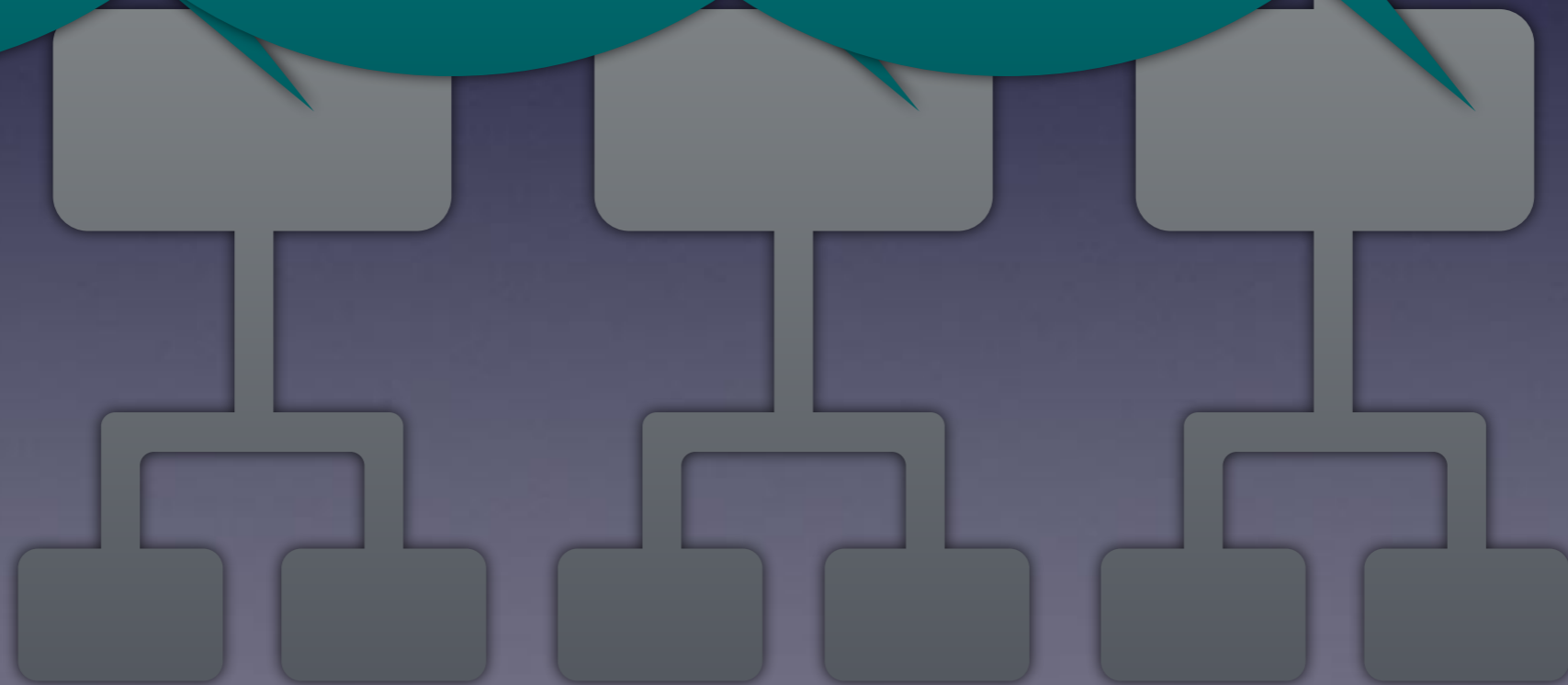
